John's use of "know" (ginōskō) implies deep, relational understanding. This knowledge stems from personal encounters with God.

Faith-Informed Intellect

While not dismissing intellectual understanding, John prioritizes faith-based revelation. This shapes believers' comprehension of divine truths.

Transformative Wisdom

True knowledge of God, according to John, results in life change. It manifests in love, obedience, and spiritual discernment.

The Divine Origin of Faith

1

God's Initiative

John presents faith as a response to God's self-revelation, not human effort.

2

Christ's Incarnation

The ultimate act of divine revelation, enabling personal knowledge of God.

3

Spirit's Indwelling

God's ongoing presence sustains and deepens faith in believers' lives.
