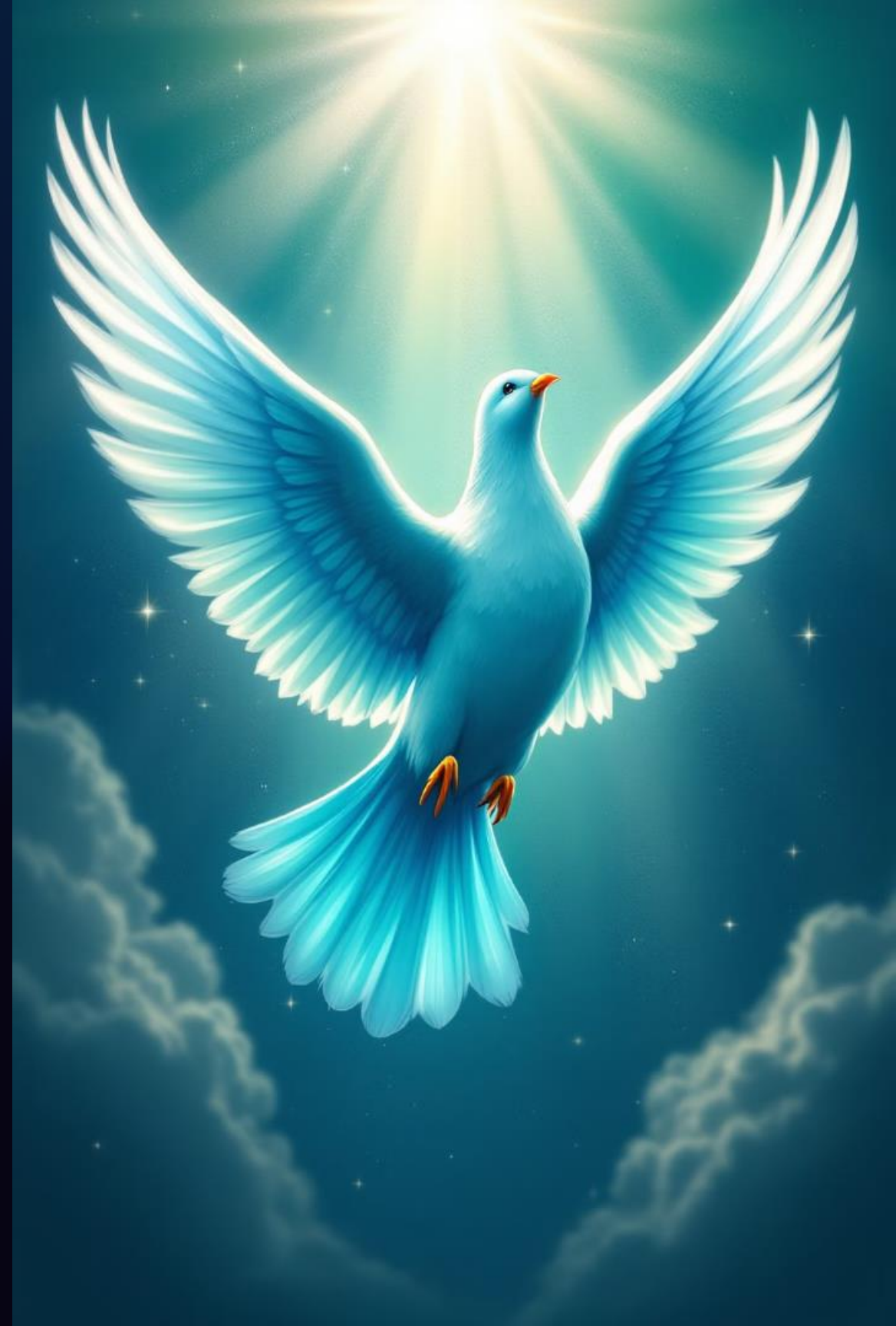
Mutual Indwelling

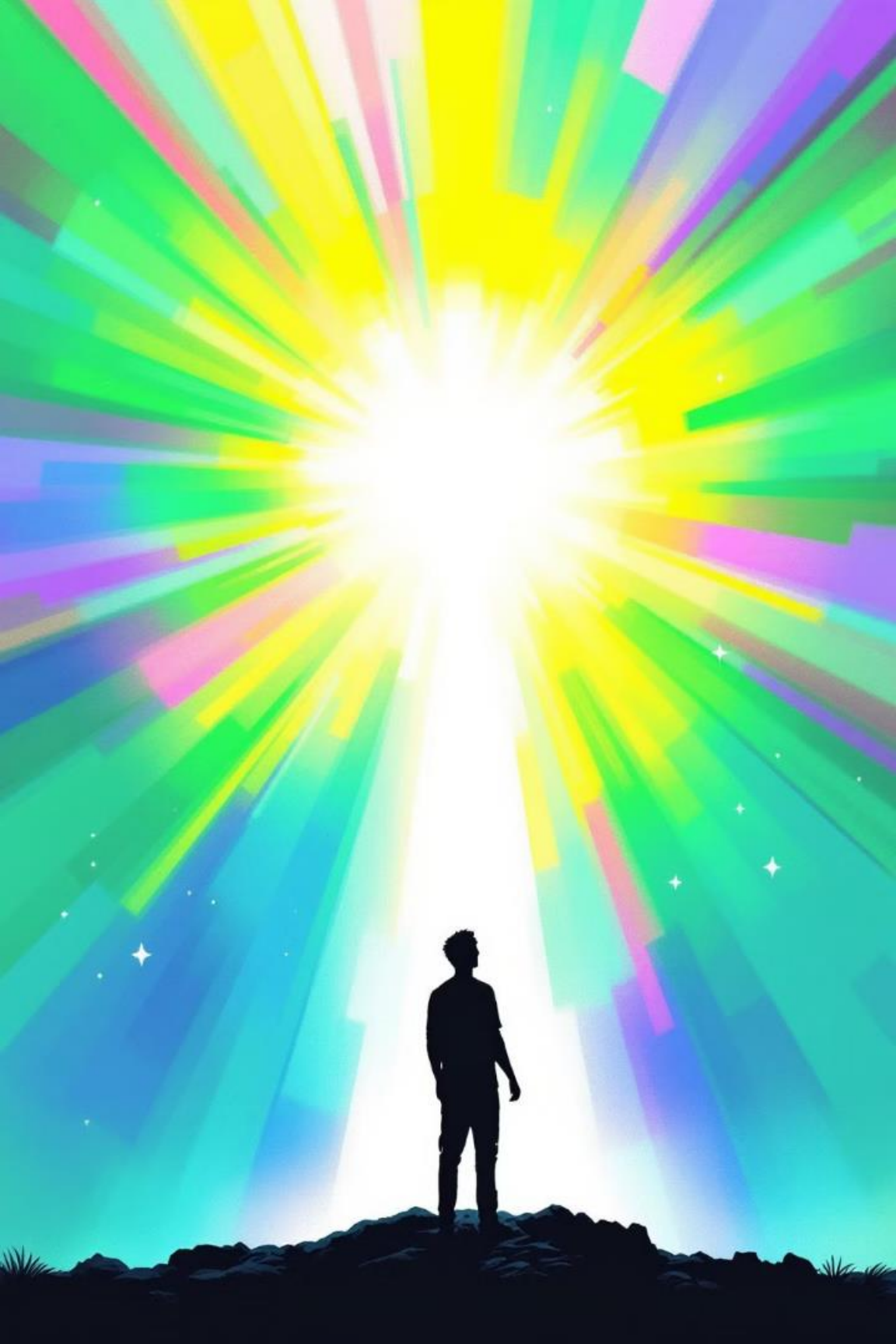
Result
