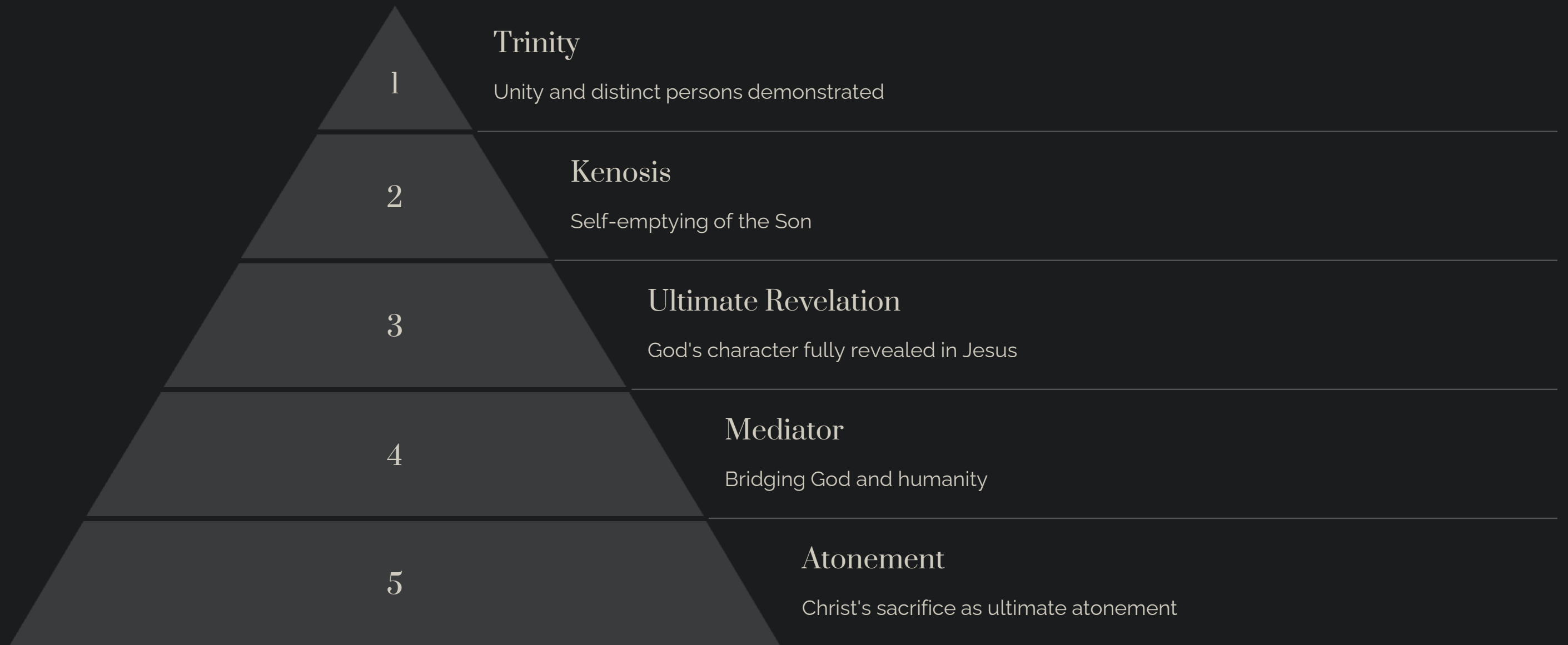
Union with Christ

Participating in local church and small groups to foster mutual indwelling of God in a communal context.

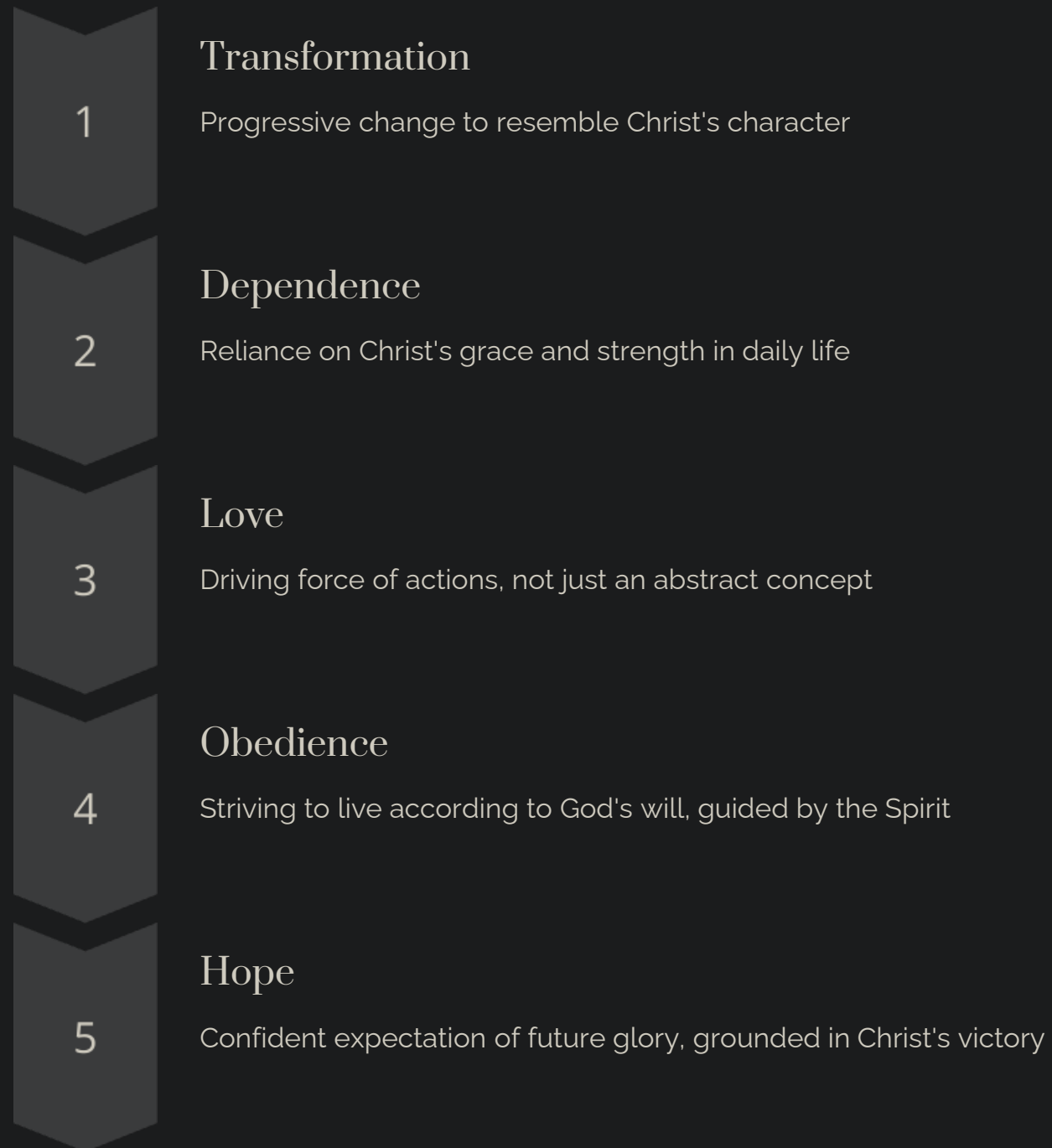
