## Definition of Obedience in the Bible

The general concept of obedience both in the <u>Old and New</u> <u>Testament</u> relates to <u>hearing</u> or hearkening to a higher authority. One of the Greek terms for obedience conveys the idea of positioning oneself under someone by submitting to their authority and command. Another Greek word for obey in the New Testament means "to trust."

According to *Holman's Illustrated Bible Dictionary* a succinct definition of biblical obedience is "to hear God's Word and act accordingly." *Eerdman's Bible Dictionary* states, "True 'hearing,' or obedience, involves the physical hearing that inspires the hearer, and a belief or trust that in turn motivates the hearer to act in accordance with the speaker's desires."

Thus, biblical obedience to God means to hear, trust, submit and <u>surrender to God</u> and his Word.
