

Main Themes

1. Mutual Indwelling

- o This theme emphasizes the reciprocal relationship between God and believers, rooted in 1 John 4:13–16. God abides in us through His Spirit, imparting divine life and love, while we abide in Him through faith, love, and obedience. This spiritual union highlights both assurance of salvation and a call to live in alignment with God's nature.
- Colossians deepens this idea by illustrating Christ as the embodiment of God, with phrases like "Christ in you, the hope of glory" (Colossians 1:27).

2. Christological Testimony

- Christ is presented as the Son of God, Savior of the world, and the visible image of the invisible God. His incarnation bridges the divine and human realms, making reconciliation with God possible.
- Colossians expands on this, depicting Christ as Creator, Sustainer, and Head of the Church, emphasizing His preeminence in all things (Colossians 1:15-20).

3. God's Love
